Field observations

North Field — Winter wheat

Observation: Crop establishment is even overall with strong tillering across the central block. Lower-lying headlands show slight yellowing after recent rainfall, with tramline wheelings remaining soft. A small patch on the western margin shows early septoria-like spotting on lower leaves.

Crop health: Good vigour overall; monitor disease pressure in damp areas.

Action priority: Medium

River Meadow — Oilseed rape

Observation: Canopy is uneven, with thinner plant stands in the southern quarter and visible flea beetle grazing on surviving leaves. Plants are moisture-stressed on lighter ground and several areas show purple tinting consistent with nutrient uptake stress. Weed pressure from volunteer cereals is increasing.

Crop health: Patchy establishment and stress symptoms; intervention likely needed this week.

Action priority: High

Hilltop Field — Spring barley

Observation: Emergence is uniform and the crop is clean with minimal weed competition. Exposed ridges are slightly backward where soil moisture is lower, but rooting appears active and there are no notable disease symptoms. Field access is good and travel risk is low.

Crop health: Healthy crop with only minor variability on exposed ground.

Action priority: Low

Recommendations

Field	Recommendation
North Field	Inspect western margin within 7 days and review lower-leaf disease progression before any fungicide decision.
River Meadow	Prioritise this field for intervention this week: assess plant population, address volunteer cereal pressure, and review nutrient requirement against soil results.
Hilltop Field	Continue routine monitoring; no urgent action indicated from the current report.

Overall note: the most time-sensitive concerns relate to the uneven oilseed rape stand in River Meadow and the need to confirm whether stress and weed pressure warrant immediate intervention.
